Deemed as an essential business, MDI products and services continued to be in demand across major markets. All four MDI facilities were kept operational to meet customer needs, while keeping employees safe. MDI invested in significant capital equipment for future growth. We secured several new program-level customers and delivered upon sales goals to drive more sustainable jobs for people with and without disabilities.



At first glance, Maggie and Abram appear to have it all: smart, well-spoken, and kind. They've been a couple since their high school days in Michigan. Little do many people know, Maggie nearly lost her life.

While driving back to college in November 2004, she hit black ice and rolled her SUV, resulting in "multiple trauma". Over 16 years, 45 surgeries, artery repairs, a below-theknee amputation in 2019, and 60+ units of blood, Maggie is well on her way back to normalcy! After receiving an "athletic foot" last May, she has been working hard at regaining her strength and running again for the first time since before the accident.
